Here is an overview of the learning goals for this week:

Spelling: Rule-When a short vowel is followed by one consonant at the end of the root word, double the last consonant and add the suffix. .

Reading: Our novel is Midnight on the Moon. This is a Magic Treehouse book by Mary Pope Osborne. During Centers will be reading about Human Rights and Famous People who have effected Human Rights in our nation. Last week we covered Slavery through the Civil War. This week we will cover segregation through the Civil Rights Act.
