Dear 2nd Grade Families,

Here is an overview of the learning goals for this week:

Spelling: Rule- **Usually, when a word ends in a consonant + 'y' we change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'es' to make it plural.**

Reading: We will be reading about Civil Rights Movement and Famous People who have effected Human Rights in our nation. Last week we covered Martin Luther King, Jr. We will cover segregation through the Civil Rights Act.

Language: Complete simple sentences with a noun, verb, adverb, and adjective. Knowing the difference between a noun and verb, and what question the adjective is answering. Knowing our Synonyms, Antonyms, and Homonyms.

Math: Subtraction with regrouping (borrowing). We will be subtracting 2 double digit numbers.

Social Studies: Human Rights with an emphasis on Black History.

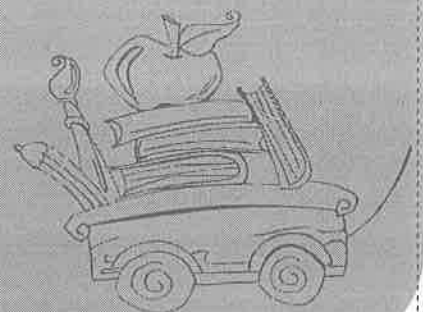
