Here is an overview of the learning goals for this week:

Vocabulary: Scientific Words related to the Moon.

Writing: D'Nealian Handwriting and 5 Sentence Complete Paragraphs. Research reports with a topic sentence that hooks the audience and a conclusion that is not a detail. The topic is evidence from research on the moon.

**Reading:** Non-Fiction Moon resources for use in our Moon Reports

Language: Complete simple sentences with a noun, verb, adverb, adjective an article adjective. Knowing the difference between a noun's adjective and verb's adverb, and what question the adjective and adverbs are answering.

Math: Telling Time to the nearest 5 minutes using the a.m. and p.m.

Social Studies: Winter Celebrations around the World. Moon; landforms, gravity, atmosphere, rotations and revolutions, exploration, and its connection to Earth.

\*If the homework packet is returned on Friday your student is given a star on the homework chart and they receive a reward ticket.


